### Scholarship Program

Project 150 is a non-profit organization that provides services to more than 5,000 homeless, displace, and disadvantaged high school students in 73 high schools in Nevada. The Scholarship Program is one of the many vehicles used by our organization to ensure that students are provided assistance to achieve higher education goals.

#### Application deadline date is Friday, April 15th, 2022 by 5pm

### Eligibility Requirements

- Be a resident of Nevada.
- Attend or plan to attend the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, University of Nevada, Reno, the College of Southern Nevada, Nevada State College or ANY accredited vocational training institute in the state of Nevada during the scholarship award year, completing a minimum of 9 credits (three classes) per semester.
- Must complete the FAFSA or Alternative Form (visit your college's financial aid website page for the Alternative form).
- Must fulfill requirements for <u>one</u> of the two scholarship application categories below.

### **Graduating High School Senior:**

- Currently attending a high school in Nevada.
- You must finish high school with an overall 3.0 weighted GPA. Please check with the school you are planning to attend for GPA requirements. Final transcripts must be received by 3 pm, June 6, 2022.
- Be actively involved in community volunteer service.

#### Current College Student:

- Currently attending or plan to attend one of the above named post-secondary institutions.
- Have maintained a 2.75 GPA and/or with the school required cumulative grade point average based on a 4.00 scale. Final transcripts must be received by 3 pm May 31, 2022.
- Enrolled in a minimum of 9 credits (three classes) per semester.
- Be actively involved in community volunteer service.

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

The Scholarship Reviewing Committee will consider all applicants based on the following:

- Eligibility criteria as defined above
- Academic records
- Community service or activities
- Letter(s) of Recommendation
- Financial need
- Essay; use correct grammar and spelling
- Consideration of work experience and/or family responsibilities
- Consideration of documented non-secondary education (i.e. technical, vocational, military etc.)
- Personal interview with the Project 150 Scholarship Committee Panel

### Required Documentation

Please review your application packet carefully before submitting and keep a copy for your records. Failure to provide any of these documents will disqualify your application.

- 1. <u>Application-</u> Must be typed or neatly handwritten. Applications that are illegible or incomplete will be disqualified. Attach extra sheets if necessary, to complete answers. Essay must be typed.
- 2. <u>Transcripts-</u> Provide your most current <u>unofficial transcript</u> from the educational institution to which you make reference in the application (i.e. high school, college, vocational, technical etc.). Final transcript for academic school year must be submitted by deadlines stated on page two of this packet. If your transcript does not provide a cumulative GPA, please provide documentation of your GPA on school letterhead signed by a school official.
- 3. <u>Letter of Recommendation-</u> Provide a current letter of recommendation from a <u>teacher or counselor</u> on school/college letterhead that addresses the following topics:
  - Academic/extracurricular achievements
  - Personal qualities such as motivation, leadership, and commitment
  - Potential of recipient.
  - Those who are returning applicants in their third and fourth year, do not have to provide a letter.
- 4. <u>Financial Summary-</u> This can be found in your *MyCSN*, *MyUNLV*, *MyUNR*, *or MyNSC* under "Finances *View Financial Aid* Choose academic year" and print/screenshot page shown. This page should have a breakdown of financial aid per semester.
- 5. <u>Postmark Deadline:</u> Friday, April 15, 2022 by 5pm. Scholarship application packets are accepted via email in PDF or original via U.S. mail no later than the postmarked deadline to:

#### **Recipients, please note that:**

- Scholarships are <u>NOT</u> transferable between institutions. Your scholarship can only be used at the institution identified on your application. If you know you will be switching from a community college to a university, please identify this on your application (i.e. "Attending CSN for Fall 2021 and UNLV Spring 2022).
- You must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 credits and maintain cumulative GPA of 2.75 to retain your scholarship during the award year.
- Academic Probation If you fail to meet the minimum requirements in any semester in which you receive funding, you will receive a strike. A letter must be sent to the Programs Manager as to why you did not meet the requirements. Eligibility can be regained only once by meeting all of the requirements listed above in your next semester. Loss of eligibility a second time will permanently remove you from the program.
